Worldwide Evangelization for Christ

WEC is a family of more than 1,800 workers from over 50 nationalities, serving in multi-cultural teams among more than 90 of the least evangelized people groups.

Our primary focus is to plant churches where there is no church.



Faith

We trust God to supply all we need to accomplish His plan for our lives and ministries despite opposition, difficulties and apparent impossibilities. This means total reliance on Him for the grace, power and resources we need to think, speak, live and serve.

Holiness

Our supreme aim is to please God in thought, word and deed through the enabling of the Holy Spirit. Holiness of life is required of those who would effectively witness to the Gospel.

Sacrifice

The Holy Spirit enables us to willingly obey Jesus' call to mission and endure whatever hardships the journey puts in our path.

Sacrifice means saying 'yes' to God in all things, without seeking unnecessary risks, yet ready to learn obedience through suffering.



Fellowship is our oneness in Christ.

Our oneness in Christ makes it possible for us to live and work together in multicultural teams as brothers and sisters, maintaining the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

We seek the mind of Christ together in decisions, and value mutual accountability and relationship over structure and authority.

Team-Based Decision Making

WEC is structured to allow our field teams to make strategic decisions autonomously. We believe that when our teams get together to pray and wait on God the Holy Spirit will lead them in a spirit of fellowship and unity. This doesn't mean we all do our own thing. We're all accountable to WEC principles and practices.



Community-Based Training and Member Care

We're convinced that community is one of God's most powerful tools for transformation, and so we work hard to nurture authentic community as we train and care for our workers.

No Financial Appeals

God has led us to adopt a financial policy that gives visible evidence to His worthiness of our trust. Seeking first His kingdom, we communicate what God is up to in our lives without appealing for funds, and then trust Him to provide what He already knows we need.



Home of the Reformation and the modern missionary movement, the church in Europe is very much in decline.
Church planting teams, along with a variety of supporting ministries exist in Albania, Belgium, Bulgaria, France, Greece, Italy, Netherlands, Germany, Switzerland, Russia, Portugal, Spain and the U.K.



Asia

Church growth in Asia has exploded. Ever increasing numbers of Korean and Chinese background believers are represented in WEC.

However, many countries are still extremely resistant to the gospel. Multicultural teams are spearheading advances into most of these least-reached areas.



Latin America

In many of these countries, the missionary role has changed from church planter to trainer and facilitator. Working with the churches to mobilize and equip Latin Americans for cross-cultural mission is a major focus on this continent. In Brazil and Mexico, WEC is involved in both church planting and mission mobilization.



Africa

WEC is working alongside emerging national churches in Burkina Faso, Chad, Cote d' Ivoire, The Congo, Equatorial Guinea, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Liberia, Guinea Bissau, Senegal, South Africa and pioneering in several North African countries.



A longstanding witness has existed among numerous Middle Eastern peoples. Workers faithfully flesh out the gospel in a huge variety of business and professional contexts. Church planting remains the focus.

Pacific

While many established churches exist in this region, WEC is active in inspiring, mobilizing and training churches in crosscultural mission involvement.

It is also modelling church planting in several locations that are home to unreached peoples.

Ministries in WEC

WEC workers are engaged in many different styles of work, concentrating on planting churches, often in hard-to-reach places. The WEC missionaries usually work in teams which are in close contact with the unreached people groups with whom they work.
